

Greetings from the MABA

Hopefully you are aware of the upcoming MABA2010 Convention scheduled for June 25-27 in Grand Rapids, Michigan. Rather than going into great detail here simply let me say we have some great events planned. You can find all the exciting details and registration forms on the MABA website at www.mababonsai.org.

On Sunday morning, June 27, during the MABA Convention, we will have the annual MABA meeting and election of officers. Officers serve for 2 year terms. Each MABA member club has one vote and you are encouraged to attend. The elected positions

are President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. An Information Bulletin will be sent out at the end of May which will list all Officer Positions and the names of those that have expressed interest. The MABA Board will also present a slate of recommended nominees. We have recently had a request for a list of regional bonsai artists. This has led to the discovery that our list is somewhat out-of date, and we're working to update it! MABA Vice-President Steve Moore has prepared the following request:

To help us in up-dating our Regional Bonsai Artist list, I'm asking for your help. (Yes,

You). Would you be willing to speak, or do a demonstration, at another club or bonsai group? If you are, we will, with your permission, add your name and contact info to the MABA information base.

Please don't let this idea frighten you. Frankly, you probably know more than you give yourself credit for. Most people do. Please read over the following questions and as you do, please refer to these descriptions:

Novice: no bonsai knowledge or experience. (This includes the general public.)

Beginner: some knowledge, but still mastering the fundamentals of bonsai care and styling, such as watering, fertilizing, winter care, and wiring.

Intermediate: comfortable with the fundamentals, but seek help/advice with advanced techniques such as grafting, and with some of your styling.

Advanced: comfortable with all but the most unusual techniques; usually don't need advice on styling.

The questions are:

- 1. What do you think is your level of bonsai knowledge? (Novice, beginner, intermediate, or advanced?)
- 2. At what level(s) would you be willing to teach and/ or demonstrate?
- 3. On what topic(s) are you comfortable speaking/teaching?
- 4. Are you willing to speak/demonstrate for other

groups, at your specified level and on your specified topics?

5. How far are you willing to drive (one way) to speak to another group?

Here are my own answers to these questions:

- 1. Intermediate
- 2. Novice or beginner
- 3. Basics of soils; tropicals and yews as bonsai; choosing nursery stock; styling demonstrations
- 4. Yes
- 5. Two hours give or take

Think about it, and decide if you can help us in this way. Then send me your answers by email, please, at aabonsai@charter.net You can number your answers as I did; I'll keep a record of the questions. I would appreciate getting answers within the next 30 days.

Thanks for considering this, and for any help you can give to help promote the love of bonsai in the MABA region!


First ever Ginkgo dig... the report: Steve Carini

Well in spite of the cold and prediction of rain, 32 excited MBS club members met on Saturday, April 3rd at 9:00AM to play in the dirt. Everyone patiently listened to Houston and me as we shared all the



mistakes we had made 2 weeks earlier, when we did a test dig. We began to dig at about 9:30 and I, for one, had a great time. The most wonderful part in my opinion, was how well we all worked together.

You see, the biggest mistake that Houston and I made was that we began by digging our own tree. This was nearly impossible, as it was too hard to navigate amongst all the closely positioned trees. It went so well when all 32 of us broke up into a few groups and just started digging. And the rain didn't stop us... in fact it was perfect for the trees. We were able to dig the trees and just set them out on the grass and the rain kept them wet. Most of the group took off by 12:30 or so and went home to warm up and



to pot their treasures. Many stayed to clean up all the mud we had tracked all over the sidewalks, and I left about 4:30... cold, wet and wiped out. I cannot remember the last time I took a nap, but I went home and I slept for 3 hours. The day could not have gone any better.

So, how many trees did we dig? Well so far, 27 members have checked in with me and the total is 177 trees, mostly all are ginkgoes, I think a few were black cherry, and one is unknown. I have not heard





from about 5 people so I bet we collected over 200 trees... WOW! I was amazed this weekend as I was showing

mine to a neighbor, when I noticed a green bud, and even more amazed the next day, when I found buds on all the trees, with one ambitious tree having seven.



I would like to sincerely thank Houston, for helping me plan and carry out this event. I would also like to thank the many who brought snacks for us to munch on all day, Bill and Janice Doyle who so graciously allowed this wacky bunch of tree nuts to dig up their yard, and of

course, all of YOU, for making this event such a success. It was really a win-win-win situation. Bill and Janice now have a navigable lot to further develop, we have some nice specimen trees, and the trees have new adoptive parents who will nurture and strive to keep them alive! Watch the newsletter in early fall for a time we can bring one or two trees to a club meeting, just to compare and contrast how well they are all doing. And next year... how about we plan a meeting on just what we should know when developing a ginkgo bonsai.



Oh, and one more thing; you all donated \$191 for the garden planting we will gift to Bill and Janice Doyle. Sometime soon I



will draw a garden plan, have Bill and Janice approve it, and set a date to do the planting. I am sure that many of you will want to help.

So today, my partner Lori hands me a recipe... it is a recipe for ginkgo porridge. It calls for rice, water, honey to taste and about 12 ginkgo nuts. She said that the next time we have an MBS event, there ought to be just the right number of ginkgo NUTS in attendance, to make a hearty porridge! Thanks Lori.
