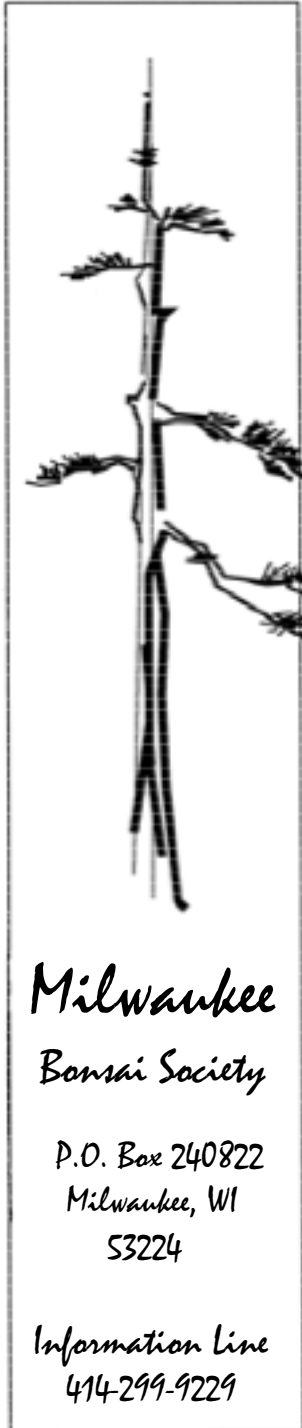

Things I must have know, but forgot...

Sometimes you hear something (maybe even multiple times), but it just doesn't sink in. Here are two tidbits worth repeating:

- When talking about the 1/3, 1/3, 1/3 principle... it doesn't necessarily mean that the lowest branch must be 1/3 the way up the trunk. If you have foliage hanging down, the lowest point can be 1/3 up the trunk.
- Wiring gives curve to the branches, pruning gives angle.
