

Newcomers to MBS

My name is John Menzel. I'm 27, a college grad working as an arborist for a tree service company, with a healthy interest in pottery and bonsai. Pottery and bonsai settle me, center me, and relax me. I tend to fidget, so keeping my hands and mind busy is an ideal way to build focus and motivation in other parts of my life.

Whether you plan to care for one bonsai, or several dozen, MBS caters to your needs by bringing in guest artists, speakers, and even inviting the club's own members to demonstrate various bonsai techniques, occasionally having to start fires. (The best demonstrations involve something being set on fire, in my opinion)

It is with some amusement that I think back through my time with MBS. I found that there are several steps that members go through when they join and "mature" with their trees. There is the first monthly meeting for a new member, which, for most, is an overwhelming and somewhat terrifying experience. Like being the new kid at school, as a newcomer, I felt out of place and everyone seemed to know what they were talking about! And I knew nothing about bonsai, all of a sudden. That feeling soon passes and come spring, the meetings, demonstrations, workshops, and even bonsai digs abound, all arranged and hosted by the club! Certain dedicated members lead bonsai classes. Novice. Intermediate, and Advanced Class. If someone is genuinely interested in

exhibiting a tree in his or her collection, or even if that someone is extremely self-conscious about the "stick-in-a-pot" that is being displayed, by working through the classes, one can greatly improve the quality and variety of his or her collection. When a guest artist is visiting, one can bet that the artist is also leading guided workshops during that week. Most workshops have quality material provided, with the alternative being able to work on your own bonsai-in-progress.

As a non-profit organization, MBS strives to live up to that term by providing great opportunities for members to learn and develop skills by supplying materials and hosting guest artists at the lowest possible cost. Fees for any activity are simply divided among the participants in the workshop to cover the cost of materials, if any, and to compensate the artist for sharing their time and experience.

The option to come as a "Silent Observer" is especially attractive if a member is unsure about the cost of a workshop and what it offers, I promise you'll be pleasantly surprised at how much fun is had. More recently, I became a member of the MBS Executive Committee as a Director, I became much more aware and enthusiastic about the goings on with the club and more importantly respectful of how much time and dedication is put towards organizing the club's activities.

I truly enjoy being a part of MBS, and I look forward to seeing new and familiar faces (and trees) this spring. I'll be the one selling his bonsai pots.

Mauro Stemberger Workshops

As you all know already, Mauro Stemberger from Feltre, Italy will visit Milwaukee for our May meeting. Mr. Stemberger is coming as the first artist in our Excellence in Bonsai Program (EIBP).

Mauro will be doing the initial styling of a monster Ponderosa Pine that he chose as his demo tree and is excited about working on it so don't miss this meeting.

Mauro will be available for "bring your own tree" workshops on the Wednesday and Thursday following the May meeting. He specializes in high mountain pines, but works with a variety of different trees (even tropicals). The all day workshops will be limited to a maximum of 5 participants each day. Registration for the workshops will be in the March newsletter and the fee will be \$100.
