

# <u>Celebrating 45 years of Exhibiting Bonsai trees</u> By Steve Co

2015 marks the 45<sup>th</sup> year that members of the Milwaukee Bonsai Society will celebrate their bonsai year by exhibiting a tree during the Annual Exhibit. The AE is our second largest exhibit and the most formal. Since the AE is judged, it is an opportunity for you to receive comments from a Bonsai Master on the state of your tree and possible improvements you could try to accomplish. The Annual Exhibit offers you a great opportunity to do this, please take advantage of it. Your tree will only be judged against other trees being exhibited by members with similar abilities (novice, intermediate and advanced).

The trees will be displayed a little differently this year but to do this we need to know the sizes of the trees to be exhibited, therefore we will need to pre-register the trees before the AE. Trees to be exhibited as a "Tree in Training" do not need to be pre-registered (no stand or companion plants for the "Trees in Training" either). Tree registration will end at noon on Wednesday September 16<sup>th</sup>. Please register your tree so we know it's coming. Unregistered trees will be placed in the Exhibit if there is room for it.

Tree drop off will be Thursday September  $17^{th}$  from 5 PM till 7:30 PM at Boerner Botanical Garden. Before you arrive at BBG with your tree be sure that the pot is clean, spider webs and bugs removed and the tree watered. Enter the front door at BBG and proceed to the lower level. Your tree will be checked in and placed in the Exhibit Hall. The Exhibit will end at 3PM on Sunday September  $20^{th}$ . You may pick up your tree from 3:30 PM till 5 PM on that day.

And don't forget the Banquet. For the very affordable price of \$30 per person you get a complete sit down dinner at Meyer's Restaurant. Check the Banquet section of the registration form and the information sheet for banquet details (final number of guests and entrée choice needs to be turned in by September 12<sup>th</sup>, don't be too late). Ted's Demonstration Bonsai, a Trident Maple Forest will be auctioned off during the Banquet.

Bring your completed registration form to the August meeting to be sure you get the workshops

Exhibit Critique and Reception

6:00 – 9:00pm Ted Matson

Ted Matson has been our clubs sensei (Japanese title used to refer to or address for master instructor) for over a decade. In 2012, Ted was honored and recognized for his great service to Golden State Bonsai Federation that also recognized his great service to the art of bonsai; someone who had extended their influence beyond the efforts of GSBF to promote the art of bonsai and encourage cooperation and unity of effort to achieve excellence within the entire bonsai community. To impress the significance of this award, we should note only one other person has ever been bestowed this award and that was John Naka.

Ted Matson began studying bonsai in 1979 in San Francisco, where he learned the basics under John Boyce. He moved to Los Angeles in 1980, where he became involved in a number of clubs and began a serious pursuit of the art, taking classes from leading masters in Southern California, including Ben Suzuki, Shig and Roy Nagatoshi, Melba Tucker, Warren Hill and John Naka. Currently Ted is the Administrative Curator of the Huntington Bonsai Collection in greater Los Angeles.

Root over Rock Shimpaku (Juniperus chinensis 'Shimpaku')

Get your hands on some great material that someone else has done all the hard work for you already. Material is some really nice shimpaku junipers over some very nice rocks. These trees have been growing over these rocks for several years and have clasped the rocks very nicely. If priced by the pound you would be getting a deal as the rocks certainly do have some weight to them. Give these trees their initial styling this fall and they will be ready for possible repotting in spring 2016 into training pots. These trees were grown in Northern California and hand-picked by the instructor. Shipped out to Wisconsin this spring so they are acclimated to our weather. They will need some winter protection for their first winter here but this material usually fairs very well with minimal attention.

This is an excellent opportunity to obtain unusual style with material suitable for our area and work with an outstanding bonsai instructor.

Twisted Pomegranates (Punica granatum)

Another great piece of material that we do not commonly see in this area. When you see the word twisted, it does not mean that the trunks of these trees have been manipulated in any way. The growth habit of this variety of trees is such that the bark takes on a twist in its appearance as the tree matures. When the conditions are correct these trees will flower and produce fruit. These trees were grown in Northern California and hand-picked by the instructor. Shipped out to Wisconsin this spring so they are acclimated to our weather. The instructor will advise on how to deal with these trees as winter approaches. Ted will guide you on what steps need to be taken to develop these trees. Give these trees their initial styling this fall and they will be ready for possible repotting in spring 2016 into training pots.

This workshop would be good for novice/beginners with minimal experience in taking a workshop or anyone interested in tropical material.


