

May Meeting

The May meeting will feature David Kreutz of Satsuki Bonsai-en. Imports LLC from ST Louis, Missouri. David started in Bonsai in 1990 as a hobby. After several years he started working with just Satsuki Azaleas and hired Joe Harris to teach him more about them After the USDA stopped all imports of material used as bonsai they opened a pilot program. David was given a permit to import plants into an approved quarantine house - and began importing his own trees. Now, he has five nurseries in Japan that he imports from. This allows him to do workshops and demos for many clubs and conventions in the states. He is a continuing student of Satsuki and is still learning new things every year.

David will be talking about and demonstrating more about Azaleas at our May meeting.



Thirteen MBS club members submitted 29 of their best bonsai for the Juror, Jennifer Price, to consider for the 2018 World Bonsai Day Exhibit. Each entry, as it was received, was numbered and placed into its own file folder. On Friday April 13, I met Jennifer in Chicago with the file folders under my arm.

It was interesting to watch her work. She went through each folder, looking at the picture(s), and the information submitted. With a brief comment about each one, she quickly separated them into three separate stacks – yes, no, and maybe. Then she went through the "yes" stack and studied each one more carefully. Next she reviewed the "no" stack and then the "maybe" stack. During this part of the process, submittals were shuffled from one stack to another.

When she was finished, there were 19 files folders in the ""yes" stack and 10 in the "no" stack. Then she reviewed the bonsai in the "no" stack once again to make sure she was comfortable with her decisions.

Finally she selected 2 bonsai from the "no" stack to be used for her demonstration on the Opening Day of the exhibit.

She started at 11 am and didn't finish until almost 2 pm. It was great fun to watch her work and her choices will create an inspirational exhibit.

Congratulations to the members of MBS who had their bonsai selected for the exhibit. They are Susan L, Pam W, Kris Z, Judy S, Rob P, Houston S, Rocio S, Jorge R, Kevin S, Michelle Z, and Jack D.

Bonsai from Bryan L and Susan L will be used in Jennifer's demonstration during the Opening Day ceremony. Her demonstration will focus on improving these two bonsai.
