First Find of Boxwood Blight in Wisconsin

We have found boxwood blight in Wisconsin for the first time at a nursery grower's operation in Kenosha County. DATCP inspectors found suspect specimens during a routine annual inspection and USDA-APHIS confirmed July 19 that they were positive for *Calonectria*, the genus of the fungus that causes boxwood blight. While *Calonectria pseudonaviculata* (syn. *Cylindrocladium buxicola*, *C. pseudonaviculatum*) is the only species known to cause boxwood blight in the US, a closely related pathogen, *Calonectria henricotiae* is associated with boxwood blight in Europe. USDA-APHIS staff are currently working to grow this this pathogen in clean culture in order to confirm the species responsible for boxwood blight in our state.

The nursery involved is working closely with DATCP to test its remaining stock, destroy plants in the block already found to be infected, and sanitize in an attempt to eradicate the disease. There was no sign of the pathogen in the 2017 inspection, so the hope is that we have caught it in a very early stage.

The grower will notify its customers who received stock, so they can take steps to check their boxwood plants. Anyone who finds signs of boxwood blight should submit samples to the UW-Madison Plant Disease Diagnostic Clinic in Madison.

Boxwood blight causes defoliation and decline of all species of boxwood, although they vary in their susceptibility. It also affects *Pachysandra terminalis* (Japanese spurge) and *Pachysandra procumbens* (Allegheny spurge). In boxwood, the most characteristic signs are brown leaf spots followed by defoliation, and black streaking on stems. In *Pachysandra*, brown leaf spots are the main symptoms.

Boxwood blight was first found in the United States in 2011, and has since been detected in more than two dozen states. The major means of spread is by movement of contaminated plant material – container- or field-grown plants or greenery used in holiday decorations. Spores can also be carried on pruning tools, clothing, equipment or vehicles that come in contact with infected plants.

There is no curative treatment for boxwood blight. Infected plants and leaf debris must be destroyed by burning, burying at least 2 feet deep, or double-

bagging and landfilling. Composting will not work. The pathogen may persist in the soil for 5-6 years, so members of the *Buxaceae* family should not be planted there following removal and destruction of infected plants. Now that Wisconsin has had a positive detection of boxwood blight, nurseries in our state that grow boxwood will need to enter into an annual boxwood cleanliness agreement with WDATCP in order to minimize the spread of this pathogen and protect our nursery industry.
