The June meeting presentation will feature a lecture on the care and management of azaleas by Rick Garcia. Mr. Garcia is a student of Nakayama-san, of Japan and has studied with him for more than 20years. He also is the owner of North American Satsuki Bonsai Center.

Satsuki azaleas generally bloom between the middle of May and the middle of June. Azaleas also have distinctly different growth patterns from most of the trees grown as bonsai. The roots on most trees try to descend to the bottom of the pot whereas the fine feeder roots of azaleas are close to the surface. Get ready to learn more!!


A message from the president








- * READ THE TREE, NOT THE BOOK
