

## LYNDEN SCULPTURE GARDEN

Harry fell in love with Peg, like some of us fell in love with bonsai.

They married in 1926, bought a house, and landscaped the forty acres around it. Then they started collecting art. They hung the paintings in their home and placed the monumental sculpture in the gardens around it. They created their own private art world.

We enjoy being surrounded by our bonsai - our "living" sculpture. We keep our art at our homes and occasionally show them in public, just like Harry and Peg did.

Now, Harry and Peg's collection of paintings are on display at the Milwaukee Art Museum. Their home, with the 53 pieces of sculpture they installed, is known as the Lynden Sculpture Garden and is open to the public.

The Milwaukee Bonsai Society (MBS) wants, and needs, to share their bonsai art with the people of Southeastern Wisconsin. So, MBS has approached the Lynden Sculpture Garden with the idea of incorporating a public bonsai garden into their collection.
