

#### President's Message

On Saturday, May 10, we commemorated World Bonsai Day with our first-ever display in the atrium of Boerner, and it can only be described as an enormous success. Our goal was to have eighteen trees in a display similar to what we do for the Silhouette Show in February, and I think we ended up with closer to twenty-five. We had them all —conifers, azaleas, other flowering trees in bloom, tropicals, and some really great deciduous trees. Even though they were not required, accent plantings were especially interesting. We also for the first time had some members bringing really nice suiseki stones to display, a trend that I hope accelerates in the future. Pam very thoughtfully stopped by to take pictures, which are now on the website.

My personal thanks go out to the hardy few who helped with all the work involved. The public relations value of this display was enormous. We have no way of knowing the exact number of people who saw the trees, but the beautiful weather brought a lot of traffic to the garden.

Since we were immediately adjacent to the admission counter, everyone coming into the garden had at least a brief look, and many took the time to go around the entire exhibit. The entire event was given a somewhat surreal character in late afternoon, when a couple of hundred high school couples-and their very watchful moms-came in to have prom pictures taken in the garden.

Boerner management was very pleased with what we put on, and they have asked that it be an annual event. Since it's just an exhibit, and not judged, it will make another low-pressure opportunity for people to get comfortable with displaying their trees.

It's almost Memorial Day weekend, and then it's just a couple of weeks to our Annual Exhibition at Lynden. This year we are very fortunate to have Jennifer Price as our guest artist and judge. If you have not had the experience of Jennifer critiquing a tree, suffice to say that she has a very positive, constructive approach, and goes out of her way to point out what you're doing right, and what is really attractive in your tree. I know that I must sound monotonous as I continually pound on why you should show your trees, but trust me, constructive criticism from a qualified judge is one of the very best ways to learn and to advance the quality of your art.

Even if you're not displaying a tree, talk up the exhibit among family and friends. Get them to come and see exactly what it is that bonsai means, and to understand why you are so passionate about it. Personally, I've spent God-know-how-may hours at dance recitals and Christmas pageants for the benefit of nieces and nephews, and I intend to spend that currency on getting family to the exhibit. I've also been telling folks that if they show up, they can ask for me and I'll give them the nickel tour.

I would also strongly encourage signing up for one of Jennifer's bring-your-own workshops. I have a large quince that has me stumped (intended], and I just don't quite know where to go from here. It will be interesting to get an entirely new perspective on what possibilities exist.


Bring items for a swap meet, bring a tree to talk about or get advice on or just bring yourself and enjoy the company of other bonsai members.




